



## Calculating Annual Civic Engagement

\$46M expended, 15,600 faculty, students and staff engaging in total of 344,000 hours.





Engaging 718,000 Philadelphians with programs in public education and health, community development and quality of life.







#### Penn's Socioeconomic Impact on Philadelphia



\$15.5 billion of economic activity annually translates to \$42M per day. Supporting 80,150 jobs equals to one-in-nine Philadelphians employed. Penn's \$272M in annual city tax revenue equals 6% of the City's General Fund.



All schools and centers engaged in varied programs supporting public education and health, community development, and quality of life; totaling \$46M expenditures, mobilizing 15,600 Penn faculty, students and staff who work 344,000 hours to civically engage with 718,000 Philadelphians.
